AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 210-37, ARTICLE II OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF BRIGANTINE PORTION AS IT RELATES TO FEES

WHEREAS, the City of Brigantine has the authority to establish fees for services within its jurisdiction as permitted by applicable regulations and laws; and

WHEREAS, the City of Brigantine is desirous of updating its fees schedule so that said fees are clearly stated in a way that will be more understandable to the general public; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Brigantine is desirous of amending said fee schedule.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City of Council of the City of Brigantine in the County of Atlantic; State of New Jersey as follows:

<u>SECTION I:</u> <u>Section 210-37</u> of the Code of the City of Brigantine shall be amended to read as follows:

Resolution 2025-241 – Declaration of Local Emergency – Beach & Dune Erosion Mayor Sera read Resolution as entitled above. Motion: Council Riordan Second: Councilman Virgilio Roll Call Vote: All in favor. Motion Carried. Mayor Sera discussed the many options regarding beach replenishment. Council Riordan spoke about the significant of tourism on the economy.

A RESOLUTION BY THE CITY OF BRIGANTINE, NEW JERSEY DECLARING A LOCAL STATE OF EMERGENCY DUE TO SEVERE BEACH AND DUNE EROSION, AND REQUESTING IMMEDIATE STATE AND FEDERAL ASSISTANCE FOR EMERGENCY BEACH REPLENISHMENT AND COASTAL RESTORATION

WHEREAS, the City of Brigantine is a barrier island community whose beaches and dunes serve as critical protection for public safety, private property, infrastructure, and the tourismbased local economy; and

WHEREAS, a series of recent coastal storms, including the October 2025 nor'easter, have caused extensive erosion, loss of protective dunes, and destruction of beach berms along significant portions of the City's oceanfront, most severely between 15th Street North and Roosevelt Boulevard; and

WHEREAS, post storm inspections have documented hazardous escarpments ("sand cliffs"), dune breaches, and significantly reduced beach width within this corridor, posing an imminent threat to oceanfront homes, streets, and public facilities; and

WHEREAS, the City lacks sufficient local financial and material resources to undertake the large-scale beach replenishment, dune reconstruction, and protective measures necessary to restore coastal stability and storm resilience; and

WHEREAS, the United States Army Corps of Engineers and the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP) are the primary agencies responsible for coastal restoration, but replenishment cycles have been delayed due to funding and scheduling constraints; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of Brigantine finds that immediate coordination with State and Federal agencies is essential to protect life, property, natural resources, and the City's economy prior to the onset of the winter storm season;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Brigantine, County of Atlantic, State of New Jersey, that:

- 1. A local state of emergency is hereby declared in response to severe beach and dune erosion along the City's oceanfront, specifically the area between 15th Street North and Roosevelt Boulevard.
- 2. The City formally requests immediate emergency assistance, funding, and technical support from the State of New Jersey and the United States Army Corps of Engineers, including expedited permitting for dredging, beach replenishment, and dune restoration.
- 3. The City Manager and City Engineer are hereby authorized and directed to take all necessary steps to secure emergency and long-term coastal protection measures, including but not limited to contracting for engineering, survey, and environmental services, and coordinating with the NJDEP Bureau of Coastal Engineering and the USACE Philadelphia District.
- 4. The Acting City Clerk shall forward certified copies of this resolution to the Governor of New Jersey, the Commissioner of the NJDEP, U.S. Representative Jeff Van Drew, Senator Vincent Polistina, Assembly Members Claire Swift and Don Guardian, and all other relevant agencies to ensure immediate review and response.
- 5. The City Council affirms its commitment to working collaboratively with all levels of government to safeguard Brigantine's residents, infrastructure, and natural coastal defenses through comprehensive and sustainable shoreline management.

A RESOLUTION BY THE CITY OF BRIGANTINE, COUNTY OF ATLANTIC, STATE OF NEW JERSEY REQUESTING APPROVAL OF ITEMS OF INSERTION OF A SPECIAL ITEM OF REVENUE AUTHORIZING AN AMENDMENT TO THE 2025 ADOPTED BUDGET

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:4-87 provides that the Director of the Division of Local Government Services may approve the insertion of any special item of revenue in the budget of any county or municipality when such item shall have been made available by law and the amount was not determined at the time of the adoption of the budget; and

WHEREAS, the director may also approve the insertion of an item of appropriation for equal amount,
