ORDINANCE #140F 2020

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CITY CODE AT CHAPTERS 181 AND 198
REGARDING ENCLOSED AREAS, NON-CONVERSION AGREEMENTS, AND
CHANNELS**

WHEREAS, the City Council of Brigantine desires to enhance its Community Rating System class and safeguard its residents from flood hazard; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of Brigantine has adopted its Watershed Management Plan pursuant to Resolution _____; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of Brigantine desires to amend its Flood Damage Prevention and Land Use ordinances in order to protect property from flood hazard.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Brigantine, County of Atlantic and State of New Jersey that the City Code, specifically Chapters 181 and 198, be and hereby is amended as follows:

SECTION 1.

§181-5 shall be modified to include the following definition:

DESIGN FLOOD ELEVATION

The Design Flood Elevation shall be the Base Flood Elevation (BFE) designated on the most recent Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM) used for regulatory purposes plus the required freeboard used to specify the minimum elevation of the bottom of the lower most floor pursuant to §181-17. Any material installed below the Design Flood Elevation (DFE) shall be flood resistant materials.

SECTION 2.

§181-12 shall be modified to include the following definition:

§ 181-12. Establishment of development permit.

E. In addition to the aforementioned information, the following is required:

- (1) Upon development completion and following the final inspection, a non-conversion agreement signed by the developer and/or property owner shall be submitted to the Brigantine City Construction Office and be recorded with the deed for the property with the Atlantic County Clerk's Office. This non-conversion agreement is a prerequisite to the issuance of a Certificate of Occupancy. The non-conversion agreement shall be enforced through the Brigantine City Construction Office and include the following conditions:
 - (a) The owner and or/developer will not convert or alter the area below the lowest floor elevated above the Design Flood Elevation what has been initially constructed and approved in such a way that would make the enclosure and structure more susceptible to flood damage.
 - (b) The area below the lowest floor elevated above the design flood elevation shall never be used for human habitation or any use excepting vehicle parking, limited storage, or building access without first becoming

compliant with this ordinance.

- (c) The owner and/or developer shall grant staff of the Brigantine City Construction Office entry and permission to inspect the enclosed area at any time to ensure compliance with the non-conversion agreement.
- (d) Mechanical, electrical, and/or plumbing devices that service the building shall not be installed below the Design Flood Elevation minus 1.0 foot.
- (e) Any openings in the walls of the enclosed shall not be blocked, obstructed, or otherwise altered to reduce the size of the openings or restrict the automatic entry and exit of floodwater.
- (f) All interior walls, ceilings, and floors beneath the lowest horizontal structural member of the lowest floor shall remain unfinished or constructed of flood-resistant materials.
- (g) The agreement shall run with the land and be enforceable while the approved structure is extant, regardless of ownership. Information regarding the non-conversion agreement shall be disclosed to successive property owners.
- (h) Any breach of this agreement shall constitute a violation of Chapter 126 of the Brigantine City Code of Ordinances.

SECTION 3.

§198-31 shall be modified to include the following rule:

E. No zoning or development permit shall be issued for a project that entails the modification, development, or alteration of existing natural channels excepting those projects that enhance the ecological functions of natural channels.

F. Should a development or zoning permit request entail channel improvement projects not impacting natural channels, Brigantine City recommends the use of natural approaches, such as those outlined in the “Ecological Solutions Involving Tidal Marshes” section of *Building Ecological Solutions to Coastal Community Hazards: A Guide for New Jersey Coastal Communities*.

(1) “Natural channels” shall be defined as bodies of water not already protected by maintained sand dunes or bulkheads.

(2) Any channels owned by the City of Brigantine that are not already actively maintained or developed shall have their shorelines preserved in their natural state.

SECTION 4. Repealer, Severability, and Effective Date.

Repealer. Any and all Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent with the terms of this Ordinances are hereby repealed to the extent of any such inconsistencies.

Severability. In the event that any clause, section, paragraph or sentence of this Ordinance is deemed to be invalid or unenforceable for any reason, then the City Council hereby declares its intent that the balance of the Ordinance not affected by said invalidity shall remain in full force and effect to extent that it allows the City to meet the goals of the ordinance.

Effective Date. This Ordinance shall take effect upon proper passage and approval in accordance with the law.

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 284 OF THE CODE OF THE CITY
OF BRIGANTINE AS IT RELATES TO HANDICAP PARKING SPACES**

WHEREAS, state statute specifically allows municipalities to establish restrictive parking zones in front of residences occupied by handicap persons; and

WHEREAS, a request has been made by the City of Brigantine Police Department concerning the withdraw of a handicap parking space that is no longer needed; and

WHEREAS, the space set forth in this Ordinance has been investigated by the Brigantine Police Department who have recommended the same.

**NOW, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF
BRIGANTINE IN THE COUNTY OF ATLANTIC AND STATE OF NEW
JERSEY AS FOLLOWS:**

SECTION 1: Section 284-59 of the Code of the City of Brigantine shall be amended by deleting the following space as a designated handicap space within the City of Brigantine:

<u>NAME OF STREET</u>	<u>LOCATION</u>
112 9 th Street North	Twenty (20) foot area in front of the property located at 112 9 th Street North

SECTION II: Upon adoption of this ordinance by the City Council of the City of Brigantine, the Department of Public Works and all other appropriate entities are authorized to take any and all steps to dismantle the appropriate signs designating the above space as a handicap parking space and to take any other action to fulfill the intention of this ordinance.

SECTION III: Severability

If any section or part of this ordinance is deemed to be invalid or illegal in any court or competent jurisdiction then said part is severable from this ordinance as a whole and the remaining selections or parts of this ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION IV: Repealer

All ordinances or portions thereof inconsistent with this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of said inconsistency.

SECTION V: Effective Date

This ordinance shall take effect after final adoption and publication as prescribed by law.

- B. Severability. In the event that any clause, section, paragraph or sentence of this Ordinance is deemed to be invalid or unenforceable for any reason, then the City Council hereby declares its intent that the balance of the Ordinance

not affected by said invalidity shall remain in full force and effect to the extent that it allows the City to meet the goals of the Ordinance.

- C. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall take effect upon proper passage in accordance with the law.

WHEREAS, on October 15, 2018, the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (“NJ DEP”) imposed an administrative penalty on the City of Brigantine (the “City”) in the amount of Forty Thousand (\$40,000.00) Dollars which penalty resulted from an analysis of alleged violations of the New Jersey Water Pollution Control Act and the New Jersey Water Quality Planning Act; and

WHEREAS, on November 7, 2018, the City filed Notice with the NJ DEP requesting an administrative hearing in regard to the above penalty and the underlying charges; and

WHEREAS, during the pendency of this matter, the City has entered into discussions with the Office of Dispute Resolution within the Department of Environmental Protection which discussions have resulted in a reduction of penalties to Twenty Thousand (\$20,000.00) Dollars without an admission of liability; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Brigantine wishes to authorize the entry into an Alternative Dispute Resolution Term Sheet authorizing settlement of this matter in the amount of Twenty Thousand (\$20,000.00) Dollars; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Environmental Protection Office of Dispute Resolution has prepared an Alternative Dispute Resolution Term Sheet (“ADR Term Sheet”), which is attached hereto and which City Council has reviewed and is authorizing the execution thereof; and

WHEREAS, it is the understanding of City Council that within forty-five(45) of the execution of the ADR Term Sheet a formal written agreement will be prepared by the Office of Dispute Resolution to more fully memorialize this settlement.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the City Council of the City of Brigantine, in the County of Atlantic, State of New Jersey, hereby authorizes the execution of the attached ADR Term Sheet.

**RESOLUTION BY THE CITY OF BRIGANTINE

LOCAL GOVERNMENT EMERGENCY FUND (CRF) GRANT**

WHEREAS, as the public health emergency associated with the COVID-19 pandemic continues, the most significant negative financial impacts faced by county and municipal governments throughout New Jersey result from extreme economic contraction, deficits in tax and fee revenues, and extraordinary increases in public safety and health and human services expenditures; and

WHEREAS, severe fiscal stress limits the ability of counties and municipalities to maintain essential services and take the steps necessary to fight COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, without substantial federal assistance, residential taxpayers would absorb the primary impact of meeting these extraordinary needs and closing any associated operating deficits; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Community Affairs (“DCA”), through the Division of Local Government Services (“DLGS” or “Division”), has been deemed the lead agency for the distribution of the Local Government Emergency Fund (the “LGEF” or “Program”), provided through an allocation of the State of New Jersey’s CARES Act Coronavirus Relief Fund (CRF Funds); and

WHEREAS, counties and municipalities excluded from the federal government’s direct CRF allocation plan, as well as those counties and municipalities that are currently the most impacted by COVID-19 in comparison to their available resources, are eligible for LGEF funds pursuant to a maximum distribution determined by formula; and

WHEREAS, a total of \$60 million is currently being made available under the Program, with a potential \$60 million more to be allocated; and

WHEREAS, LGEF Grants exist to support costs incurred as part of a local unit’s response to COVID-19.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City of Brigantine, that the County of Atlantic will apply for a LGEF Grant up to the amount of \$124,099.00.
