#### CITY OF BRIGANTINE

#### ORDINANCE NO. 7 OF 2022

BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING A SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION OF \$2,500,000 FOR THE RECONSTRUCTION OF THE PUBLIC WORKS BUILDING IN AND BY THE CITY OF BRIGANTINE, IN THE COUNTY OF ATLANTIC, NEW JERSEY AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$2,375,000 BONDS OR NOTES OF THE CITY TO FINANCE PART OF THE COST THEREOF.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BRIGANTINE, IN THE COUNTY OF ATLANTIC, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring) AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The improvement described in Section 3(a) of this bond ordinance has heretofore been authorized to be undertaken by the City of Brigantine, in the County of Atlantic, New Jersey (the "City") as a general improvement. For the improvement or purpose described in Section 3(a), there is hereby appropriated the supplemental amount of \$2,500,000, such sum being in addition to the \$600,000 portion of the \$1,714,000 appropriated therefor in Section 3(d) of Bond Ordinance #12-2019 of the City, finally adopted August 7, 2019 (the "Original Bond Ordinance"), and including the sum of \$125,000 as the additional down payment required by the Local Bond Law. The additional down payment is now available by virtue of provision for down payment or for capital improvement purposes in one or more previously adopted budgets.

- Section 2. In order to finance the additional cost of the improvement or purpose not covered by application of the additional down payment, negotiable bonds are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$2,375,000 pursuant to the Local Bond Law. In anticipation of the issuance of the bonds, negotiable bond anticipation notes are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law.
- Section 3. (a) The improvement heretofore authorized and the purpose for the financing of which the bonds are to be issued is the reconstruction of the Public Works Building, including all work and materials necessary therefor and incidental thereto and further including all related costs and expenditures incidental thereto, as described in Section 3(d) of the Original Bond Ordinance.
- (b) The estimated maximum amount of bonds or bond anticipation notes to be issued for the improvement or purpose is \$2,945,000, including the \$570,000 portion of the \$1,628,800 authorized by Section 3(d) of the Original Bond Ordinance and the \$2,375,000 bonds or bond anticipation notes authorized herein.
- (c) The estimated cost of the improvement or purpose is \$3,100,000, including the \$600,000 portion of the \$1,714,000 appropriated by Section 3(d) of the Original Bond Ordinance and the \$2,500,000 appropriated herein.
- Section 4. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the chief financial officer; provided that no bond anticipation note shall mature later than one year from its date, unless such bond anticipation notes mature at such later date in accordance with applicable law. The bond anticipation notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be

determined by the chief financial officer. The chief financial officer shall determine all matters in connection with bond anticipation notes issued pursuant to this bond ordinance, and the chief financial officer's signature upon the bond anticipation notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of the Local Bond Law or other applicable law. The chief financial officer is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the bond anticipation notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The chief financial officer is directed to report in writing to the governing body at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the bond anticipation notes pursuant to this bond ordinance is made. Such report must include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the bond anticipation notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

Section 5. The City hereby certifies that it has adopted a capital budget or a temporary capital budget, as applicable. The capital or temporary capital budget of the City is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this bond ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. To the extent that the purposes authorized herein are inconsistent with the adopted capital or temporary capital budget, a revised capital or temporary capital budget has been filed with the Division of Local Government Services.

Section 6. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:

- (a) The improvement or purpose described in Section 3(a) of this bond ordinance is not a current expense. It is an improvement or purpose that the City may lawfully undertake as a general improvement, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefitted thereby.
- (b) The period of usefulness of the improvement or purpose within the limitations of the Local Bond Law, according to the reasonable life thereof computed from the date of the bonds authorized by this bond ordinance, is 20 years.
- (c) The Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly prepared and filed in the office of the Clerk, and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey. Such statement shows that the gross debt of the City as defined in the Local Bond Law is increased by the authorization of the bonds and notes provided in this bond ordinance by \$2,375,000, and the obligations authorized herein will be within all debt limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law.
- (d) An additional amount of \$500,000 is provided for herein for items of expense listed in and permitted under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20.
- Section 7. The City hereby declares the intent of the City to issue bonds or bond anticipation notes in the amount authorized in Section 2 of this bond ordinance and to use the proceeds to pay or reimburse expenditures for the costs of the purposes described in Section 3(a) of this bond ordinance. This Section 7 is a declaration of intent within the meaning and for purposes of the Treasury Regulations.

Section 8. Any grant moneys received for the purpose described in Section 3(a) hereof shall be applied either to direct payment of the cost of the improvement or to payment of the obligations issued pursuant to this bond ordinance. The amount of obligations authorized but not issued hereunder shall be reduced to the extent that such funds are so used.

Section 9. The chief financial officer of the City is hereby authorized to prepare and to update from time to time as necessary a financial disclosure document to be distributed in connection with the sale of obligations of the City and to execute such disclosure document on behalf of the City. The chief financial officer is further authorized to enter into the appropriate undertaking to provide secondary market disclosure on behalf of the City pursuant to Rule 15c2-12 of the Securities and Exchange Commission (the "Rule") for the benefit of holders and beneficial owners of obligations of the City and to amend such undertaking from time to time in connection with any change in law, or interpretation thereof, provided such undertaking is and continues to be, in the opinion of a nationally recognized bond counsel, consistent with the requirements of the Rule. In the event that the City fails to comply with its undertaking, the City shall not be liable for any monetary damages, and the remedy shall be limited to specific performance of the undertaking.

Section 10. The full faith and credit of the City are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this bond ordinance. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the City, and the City shall be obligated to levy *ad valorem* taxes upon all the taxable property within the City

for the payment of the obligations and the interest thereon without limitation of rate or amount.

Section 11. This bond ordinance shall take effect 20 days after the first publication thereof after final adoption, as provided by the Local Bond Law.

WHEREAS, the Local Redevelopment and Housing Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-1, et seq., as amended and supplemented ("Redevelopment Law"), provides a process for municipalities to participate in the redevelopment and improvement of areas in need of rehabilitation or redevelopment; and

**WHEREAS**, Brigantine Marina and Paddle Club, LLC c/o M. Sean Scarborough, Owner, owns a parcel of property located at 4401 Atlantic-Brigantine Boulevard, Block 5702, Lots 7, 7.01, 7.02, 8, and 9, (the "Property"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution 2021-141, the City accepted a recommendation of the Brigantine Planning Board to designate the Property at Block 5702, Lots 7, 7.01, 7.02, 8 and 9 as a non-condemnation area in need of redevelopment; and

WHEREAS, thereafter, the City authorized the preparation of a Redevelopment Plan for the area comprised of the Property, and referred to as The Bayside Marina Redevelopment Area, (the "Redevelopment Plan"), and

**WHEREAS**, the Mayor and City Council reviewed the Redevelopment Plan and adopted the Bayside Marina Redevelopment Plan on August 18, 2021 pursuant to Ordinance No. 18-2021;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 2021-165, the City designated Brigantine Marine and Paddle, LLC as the Conditional Redeveloper (hereinafter "Conditional Redeveloper") of the Bayside Marina Redevelopment Area located on Block 5702, Lots 7, 7.01, 7.02, 8 and 9, in the City of Brigantine, and, further, authorized the negotiation of a Redeveloper's Agreement with Brigantine Marine and Paddle, LLC, c/o M. Sean Scarborough; and

WHEREAS, thereafter the City and Conditional Redeveloper proceeded with negotiations and pursuant to Resolution No. 2021-218, executed a Redeveloper's Agreement on December 17, 2021; and

WHEREAS, at this time, the City and Conditional Redeveloper have identified the need to amend the Redeveloper's Agreement to Section 3.1 as it relates to the application of the Conditional Redeveloper seeking issuance of a "Club License" as such license is described in N.J.S.A. 33:12(5) and at N.J.A.C. 13:2-8.1, et. seq; and

WHEREAS, the amendment is attached hereto and among the minor changes in Section 3.1, the following language is included concerning the permitted tax exempt status options of a Club Licensee:

"Additionally, the proposed club licensee shall be either: (a) an affiliate entity of the within Redeveloper which has been granted tax-exempt status by the internal Revenue Service ("IRS") pursuant to internal Revenue Code ("IRC") §501(c)(3); or b) is a New Jersey non-profit corporation that is a constitute unit, duly enfranchised and credentialed chapter and/or member club of another New Jersey non-profit corporation that has been inexistence for at lest three years, has at least 60 members, and which has been granted tax-exempt status by the IRS pursuant to IRC §501(c)(7) as a "club organized for pleasure, recreation, and other nonprofitable purposes, substantially all of the

activities of which are for such purposes and no part of the earnings of which inures to the benefit of any private shareholder.".

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Brigantine that the Mayor and City Council are hereby authorized to execute an Amendment to the Redeveloper's Agreement with BRIGANTINE MARINE AND PADDLE CLUB, LLC c/o M. #### SUNDOWN CITYWIDE FOURTH FRIDAYS

Sponsored by The Brigantine Chamber of Commerce

Last year the Brigantine Chamber of Commerce asked their members to stay open on Wednesday Nights in the summer in an effort to extend business hours and attract more seasonal customers. Having the event weekly proved to be too often.
