ORDINANCE NO. 6 OF 2023

BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE BEACH
REPLENISHMENT PROJECT FROM THE BRIGANTINE
INLET TO THE GREAT EGG HARBOR INLET IN AND BY
THE CITY OF BRIGANTINE, IN THE COUNTY OF
ATLANTIC, NEW JERSEY, APPROPRIATING \$2,000,000
THEREFOR AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF
\$1,900,000 BONDS OR NOTES OF THE CITY TO
FINANCE PART OF THE COST THEREOF.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BRIGANTINE, IN
THE COUNTY OF ATLANTIC, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all members
thereof affirmatively concurring) AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The improvement described in Section 3(a) of this bond ordinance
is hereby authorized to be undertaken by the City of Brigantine, in the County of
Atlantic, New Jersey (the "City") as a general improvement. For the improvement or
purpose described in Section 3(a), there is hereby appropriated the sum of \$2,000,000,
including the sum of \$100,000 as the down payment required by the Local Bond Law.
The down payment is now available by virtue of provision for down payment or for
capital improvement purposes in one or more previously adopted budgets.

Section 2. In order to finance the cost of the improvement or purpose not
covered by application of the down payment, negotiable bonds are hereby authorized to
be issued in the principal amount of \$1,900,000 pursuant to the Local Bond Law. In

anticipation of the issuance of the bonds, negotiable bond anticipation notes are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law.

Section 3. (a) The improvement hereby authorized and the purpose for the financing of which the bonds are to be issued is the Beach Replenishment Project, from the Brigantine Inlet to the Great Egg Harbor Inlet, including all renourishment activities that may include beach fill, dune, fence and crossover repair, plantings and mobilization, and further including all work and materials necessary therefor and incidental thereto and all related costs and expenses incidental thereto.

(b) The estimated maximum amount of bonds or bond anticipation notes to be issued for the improvement or purpose is as stated in Section 2 hereof.

(c) The estimated total cost of the City's share of the improvement or purpose is \$18,932,000, with the federal government paying 65% of such cost. The remaining 35% of such cost will be paid as follows: 75% by the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection and 25% by the City. The estimated cost of the City's share the improvement or purpose is equal to the amount of the appropriation herein made therefor.

Section 4. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the chief financial officer; provided that no bond anticipation note shall mature later than one year from its date, unless such bond anticipation notes are permitted to mature at such later date in accordance with applicable law. The bond anticipation notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the chief financial officer. The chief financial

officer shall determine all matters in connection with bond anticipation notes issued pursuant to this bond ordinance, and the chief financial officer's signature upon the bond anticipation notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of the Local Bond Law or other applicable law. The chief financial officer is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the bond anticipation notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The chief financial officer is directed to report in writing to the governing body at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the bond anticipation notes pursuant to this bond ordinance is made. Such report must include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the bond anticipation notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

Section 5. The City hereby certifies that it has adopted a capital budget or a temporary capital budget, as applicable. The capital or temporary capital budget of the City is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this bond ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. To the extent that the purposes authorized herein are inconsistent with the adopted capital or temporary capital budget, a revised capital or temporary capital budget has been filed with the Division of Local Government Services.

Section 6. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:

(a) The improvement or purpose described in Section 3(a) of this bond ordinance is not a current expense. It is an improvement or purpose that the City may lawfully undertake as a general improvement, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefitted thereby.

(b) The period of usefulness of the improvement or purpose within the limitations of the Local Bond Law, according to the reasonable life thereof computed from the date of the bonds authorized by this bond ordinance, is 10 years.

(c) The Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly prepared and filed in the office of the Clerk, and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey. Such statement shows that the gross debt of the City as defined in the Local Bond Law is increased by the authorization of the bonds and notes provided in this bond ordinance by \$1,900,000, and the obligations authorized herein will be within all debt limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law.

(d) An aggregate amount not exceeding \$350,000 for items of expense listed in and permitted under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20 is included in the estimated cost indicated herein for the purpose or improvement.

Section 7. The City hereby declares the intent of the City to issue bonds or bond anticipation notes in the amount authorized in Section 2 of this bond ordinance and to use the proceeds to pay or reimburse expenditures for the costs of the purposes described in Section 3(a) of this bond ordinance. This Section 7 is a declaration of intent within the meaning and for purposes of the Treasury Regulations.

Section 8. Any grant moneys received for the purpose described in Section 3(a) hereof shall be applied either to direct payment of the cost of the improvement or to payment of the obligations issued pursuant to this bond ordinance. The amount of obligations authorized but not issued hereunder shall be reduced to the extent that such funds are so used.

Section 9. The chief financial officer of the City is hereby authorized to prepare and to update from time to time as necessary a financial disclosure document to be distributed in connection with the sale of obligations of the City and to execute such disclosure document on behalf of the City. The chief financial officer is further authorized to enter into the appropriate undertaking to provide secondary market disclosure on behalf of the City pursuant to Rule 15c2-12 of the Securities and Exchange Commission (the "Rule") for the benefit of holders and beneficial owners of obligations of the City and to amend such undertaking from time to time in connection with any change in law, or interpretation thereof, provided such undertaking is and continues to be, in the opinion of a nationally recognized bond counsel, consistent with the requirements of the Rule. In the event that the City fails to comply with its undertaking, the City shall not be liable for any monetary damages, and the remedy shall be limited to specific performance of the undertaking.

Section 10. The full faith and credit of the City are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this bond ordinance. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the City, and the City shall be obligated to levy *ad valorem* taxes upon all the taxable property

within the City for the payment of the obligations and the interest thereon without limitation of rate or amount.

Section 11. This bond ordinance shall take effect 20 days after the first publication thereof after final adoption, as provided by the Local Bond Law.

ORDINANCE NO. 7 OF 2023

**“AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 210-37, ARTICLE II OF
THE CODE OF THE CITY OF BRIGANTINE
AS IT RELATES TO HANDGUN PERMITS AND FIREARM I.D. CARDS”**

WHEREAS, the City of Brigantine is permitted by its police power to establish certain fees for services within the City of Brigantine; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Brigantine desires to amend its fee schedule to provide for certain fees.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BRIGANTINE IN THE COUNTY OF ATLANTIC, STATE OF NEW JERSEY AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The following fees are hereby established:

License, Permit or Service	Fee
Handgun, permit to purchase	\$25.00
Handgun, permit to carry	\$150.00
Permit to purchase handgun	\$25.00
Permit to carry handgun	\$150.00

Section 2.

License, Permit or Service	Fee
Firearms purchaser identification cards	\$50.00

Section 3. Chapter 210 shall remain in full force and effect to the extent not modified herein.

Section 4. Repealer, Severability, and Effective Date.

- A. Repealer. Any and all Ordinances inconsistent with the terms of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of any such inconsistencies.
- B. Severability. In the event that any clause, section, paragraph or sentence of this Ordinance is deemed to be invalid or unenforceable for any reason, then the City Council hereby declares its intent that the balance of the Ordinance not affected by said invalidity shall remain in full force and effect to the extent that it allows the City to meet the goals of the Ordinance.

C. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall take effect upon proper passage in accordance with the law.

WHEREAS, the Atlantic County Utilities Authority (hereinafter the “ACUA”) is a duly formed utility authority pursuant to the laws of the State of New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, the ACUA has experience in trash removal on public streets and property; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:11-5(2) permits the City to contract for such services with the ACUA without public bidding; and

WHEREAS, the City has reviewed the qualifications of the ACUA and finds that the ACUA has the appropriate capabilities to manage, maintain and provide the necessary trash removal services; and

WHEREAS, the City and the ACUA have negotiated terms of a shared services agreement which would permit the ACUA to provide services required by the City.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Brigantine that the Mayor, City Manager and the City Clerk are authorized to execute a shared services agreement with the ACUA for the provision of trash removal services in the City of Brigantine.

WHEREAS, the City of Brigantine Tax Collector in consultation with the City of Brigantine Chief Financial Officer has computed an estimated tax levy in accordance with N.J.S.A. 54:4-66.3, and they have both signed a certification showing the tax levies for the previous year, the tax rates and the range of permitted estimated tax levies; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the City of Brigantine, County of Atlantic, State of New Jersey, on the 19th day of April 2023 as follows:

1. The City of Brigantine Tax Collector is hereby authorized and directed to prepare and issue estimated tax bills for the City for the third installment of 2023 taxes. The Tax Collector shall proceed and take such actions as are permitted and required by L. 1994, c.72 (N.J.S.A. 54:4-66.2 and 54.4-66.3).
2. The entire estimated tax levy for 2023 is hereby set at \$61,831,064.94
3. In accordance with the law the third installment of 2023 taxes shall not be subject to interest until the later of August tenth or the twenty-fifth calendar day after the date the estimated tax bills were mailed.






Dear Council Members
