#### CITY OF BRIGANTINE

#### ORDINANCE NO. 17 OF 2022

BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE ACQUISITION OF A LADDER FIRE TRUCK IN AND BY THE CITY OF BRIGANTINE, IN THE COUNTY OF ATLANTIC, NEW JERSEY, APPROPRIATING \$1,700,000 THEREFOR AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$1,615,000 BONDS OR NOTES OF THE CITY TO FINANCE PART OF THE COST THEREOF.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BRIGANTINE, IN THE COUNTY OF ATLANTIC, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring) AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The improvement described in Section 3(a) of this bond ordinance is hereby authorized to be undertaken by the City of Brigantine, in the County of Atlantic, New Jersey (the "City") as a general improvement. For the improvement or purpose described in Section 3(a), there is hereby appropriated the sum of \$1,700,000, including the sum of \$85,000 as the down payment required by the Local Bond Law. The down payment is now available by virtue of provision for down payment or for capital improvement purposes in one or more previously adopted budgets.

Section 2. In order to finance the cost of the improvement or purpose not covered by application of the down payment, negotiable bonds are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$1,615,000 pursuant to the Local Bond Law. In anticipation of the issuance of the bonds, negotiable bond anticipation notes are hereby

authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law.

- Section 3. (a) The improvement hereby authorized and the purpose for the financing of which the bonds are to be issued is the acquisition of a ladder fire truck, including all related costs and expenditures necessary therefor and incidental thereto.
- (b) The estimated maximum amount of bonds or bond anticipation notes to be issued for the improvement or purpose is as stated in Section 2 hereof.
- (c) The estimated cost of the improvement or purpose is equal to the amount of the appropriation herein made therefor.

Section 4. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the chief financial officer; provided that no bond anticipation note shall mature later than one year from its date, unless such bond anticipation notes are permitted to mature at such later date in accordance with applicable law. The bond anticipation notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the chief financial officer. The chief financial officer shall determine all matters in connection with bond anticipation notes issued pursuant to this bond ordinance, and the chief financial officer's signature upon the bond anticipation notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of the Local Bond Law or other applicable law. The chief financial officer is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the bond anticipation notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of

delivery thereof. The chief financial officer is directed to report in writing to the governing body at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the bond anticipation notes pursuant to this bond ordinance is made. Such report must include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the bond anticipation notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

Section 5. The City hereby certifies that it has adopted a capital budget or a temporary capital budget, as applicable. The capital or temporary capital budget of the City is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this bond ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. To the extent that the purposes authorized herein are inconsistent with the adopted capital or temporary capital budget, a revised capital or temporary capital budget has been filed with the Division of Local Government Services.

Section 6. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:

- (a) The improvement or purpose described in Section 3(a) of this bond ordinance is not a current expense. It is an improvement or purpose that the City may lawfully undertake as a general improvement, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefitted thereby.
- (b) The period of usefulness of the improvement or purpose within the limitations of the Local Bond Law, according to the reasonable life thereof computed from the date of the bonds authorized by this bond ordinance, is 10 years.
- (c) The Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly prepared and filed in the office of the Clerk, and a complete executed

duplicate thereof has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey. Such statement shows that the gross debt of the City as defined in the Local Bond Law is increased by the authorization of the bonds and notes provided in this bond ordinance by \$1,615,000, and the obligations authorized herein will be within all debt limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law.

- (d) An aggregate amount not exceeding \$100,000 for items of expense listed in and permitted under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20 is included in the estimated cost indicated herein for the purpose or improvement.
- Section 7. The City hereby declares the intent of the City to issue bonds or bond anticipation notes in the amount authorized in Section 2 of this bond ordinance and to use the proceeds to pay or reimburse expenditures for the costs of the purposes described in Section 3(a) of this bond ordinance. This Section 7 is a declaration of intent within the meaning and for purposes of the Treasury Regulations.
- Section 8. Any grant moneys received for the purpose described in Section 3(a) hereof shall be applied either to direct payment of the cost of the improvement or to payment of the obligations issued pursuant to this bond ordinance. The amount of obligations authorized but not issued hereunder shall be reduced to the extent that such funds are so used.
- Section 9. The chief financial officer of the City is hereby authorized to prepare and to update from time to time as necessary a financial disclosure document to be distributed in connection with the sale of obligations of the City and to execute such disclosure document on behalf of the City. The chief financial officer is further

authorized to enter into the appropriate undertaking to provide secondary market

disclosure on behalf of the City pursuant to Rule 15c2-12 of the Securities and

Exchange Commission (the "Rule") for the benefit of holders and beneficial owners of

obligations of the City and to amend such undertaking from time to time in connection

with any change in law, or interpretation thereof, provided such undertaking is and

continues to be, in the opinion of a nationally recognized bond counsel, consistent with

the requirements of the Rule. In the event that the City fails to comply with its

undertaking, the City shall not be liable for any monetary damages, and the remedy

shall be limited to specific performance of the undertaking.

Section 10. The full faith and credit of the City are hereby pledged to the

punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by

this bond ordinance. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the City,

and the City shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable property

within the City for the payment of the obligations and the interest thereon without

limitation of rate or amount.

Section 11. This bond ordinance shall take effect 20 days after the first

publication thereof after final adoption, as provided by the Local Bond Law.

#### **Affordable Housing Trust Fund Spending Plan**

#### City of Brigantine / Atlantic County

#### November 2022

#### **INTRODUCTION**

The City of Brigantine has prepared a Housing Element and Fair Share plan that addresses its regional fair share of the affordable housing need in accordance with the Municipal Land Use Law (N.J.S.A. 40:55D-1 et seq.), the Fair Housing Act (N.J.S.A. 52:27D-301) and the regulations of the Council on Affordable Housing (COAH) (N.J.A.C. 5:97-1 et seq. and N.J.A.C. 5:96-1 et seq.). A development fee ordinance creating a dedicated revenue source for affordable housing was approved by COAH on October 5, 2004 and adopted by the municipality on October 20, 2004. The development fee ordinance was later amended and then adopted by City Council on August 15, 2018 as part of the City's Third Round Final Judgment of Compliance and Repose of December 31, 2018. The Development Fee Ordinance establishes the City of Brigantine affordable housing trust fund for which this spending plan is prepared. In August of 2018, the City prepared a Spending Plan. This Spending Plan was approved by the Court as part of the City's Final Judgment of Compliance and Repose of December 31, 2018. The City is now amending its Spending Plan to account for substantial unanticipated additional development fees which have been collected since August of 2018.

As of July 1, 2022, the City of Brigantine has collected \$2,623,738.56, expended \$552,151.98, resulting in a balance of \$2,071,586.58. All development fees, payments in lieu of constructing affordable units on site, funds from the sale of units with extinguished controls, and interest generated by the fees are deposited in a separate interest-bearing affordable housing trust fund in the TD Bank for the purposes of affordable housing. These funds shall be spent in accordance with N.J.A.C. 5:97-8.7-8.9 as described in the sections that follow.

The City of Brigantine first petitioned COAH for substantive certification on September 7, 2004 and received prior approval to maintain an affordable housing trust fund on October 5, 2004.

#### 1. REVENUES FOR CERTIFICATION PERIOD

To calculate a projection of revenue anticipated during the period of Compliance and Repose, the City of Brigantine considered the following:

#### (a) Development fees:

- 1. Residential and nonresidential projects which have had development fees imposed upon them at the time of preliminary or final development approvals; \$2,530,244.59
- 2. All projects currently before the planning and zoning boards for development approvals that may apply for building permits and certificates of occupancy; and (see #3 below.)
- 3. Future development that is likely to occur based on historical rates of development. \$320,000.00

#### (b) Payment in lieu (PIL):

Actual and committed payments in lieu (PIL) of construction from developers as follows:

No other funds have been or are anticipated to be collected.

#### (d) Projected interest:

Interest on the projected revenue in the municipal affordable housing trust fund at the current average interest rate of one percent. \$28,493.97

The City of Brigantine projects a total of \$323,200.00 in revenue to be collected between July 1, 2022 and December 31, 2025. All interest earned on the account shall accrue to the account to be used only for the purposes of affordable housing.

#### 2. ADMINISTRATIVE MECHANISM TO COLLECT AND DISTRIBUTE FUNDS

The following procedural sequence for the collection and distribution of development fee revenues shall be followed by the City of Brigantine:

#### (a) Collection of development fee revenues:

Collection of development fee revenues shall be consistent with the City of Brigantine's development fee ordinance for both residential and non-residential developments in accordance with COAH's rules and P.L.2008, c.46, sections 8 (C. 52:27D-329.2) and 32-38 (C. 40:55D-8.1 through 8.7). See Brigantine City Code Section 150-4 and Section 150-5.

#### (b) Distribution of development fee revenues:

The governing body shall adopt a resolution authorizing the expenditure of development fee revenues consistent with the approved spending plan. Once a request has been approved by resolution, the CFO shall release the requested revenue from the trust fund for the specific use approved in the governing body's resolution.

#### 3. DESCRIPTION OF ANTICIPATED USE OF AFFORDABLE HOUSING FUNDS

#### (a) Rehabilitation and new construction programs and projects (N.J.A.C. 5:97-8.7)

The City of Brigantine will dedicate up to \$100,000.00 to a Market to Affordable Program for the sixth unit (see detailed descriptions in Fair Share Plan). An anticipated excess of \$119,391.05 will also be dedicated to the market to affordable program.

Market to Affordable Program Total: \$219,391.05 (This amount includes up to \$100,000.00 for the sixth unit and an anticipated excess of \$119,391.05)

**VOADV Project:** \$950,000.00 (This amount includes \$850,000.00 to VOADV (including \$350,000 for acquisition of Civic Center property from City) and \$100,000.00 for demolition and asbestos removal at Civic Center)

The City of Brigantine will dedicate \$873,731.57 from the affordable housing trust fund to render units more affordable, including \$291,243.86 to render units more affordable to households earning 30 percent or less of median income by region, as follows:

Security deposit assistance, closing costs, down payment assistance and/or convert low income rental units to very low income units, low interest loans, rental assistance, assistance with homeowner's association or condominium fees and special assessments and assistance with emergency repairs and any other program contemplated by the City's June 2022 Affordability Assistance Manual prepared by Triad.

#### (c) Administrative Expenses (N.J.A.C. 5:97-8.9)

The City of Brigantine projects that \$302,154.72 will be available from the affordable housing trust fund to be used for administrative purposes. Projected administrative expenditures, subject to the 20 percent cap, are as follows:

Administrative costs may include the costs of salaries and benefits for municipal employees including the municipal housing liaison and support staff, or consultants' fees necessary to develop or implement municipal housing programs such as the preparation of amendments to the housing element and fair share plan, spending plan, the implementation of the affirmative marketing program, the costs of income qualifying households and of monitoring implementation.

#### 5. EXCESS OR SHORTFALL OF FUNDS

Pursuant to the Housing Element and Fair Share Plan, the governing body of the City of Brigantine has adopted a resolution agreeing to fund any shortfall of funds required for implementing the Market to Affordable Program and the VOADV. In the event that a shortfall of anticipated revenues occurs, the City of Brigantine agreed to bond for any shortfall.

In the event of excess funds, any remaining funds above the amount necessary to satisfy the municipal affordable housing obligation will be used for the Market to Affordable Program. In the event of excess funds, the City intends to dedicate the funds towards emerging compliance mechanisms that have yet to be identified. This may include additional rehabilitation of existing deficient housing units.

#### 6. BARRIER FREE ESCROW

Collection and distribution of barrier free funds shall be consistent with the City of Brigantine's Affordable Housing Ordinance, Section B Accessible Townhouse Units and in accordance with N.J.A.C. 5:97-8.5.

#### **SUMMARY**

The City of Brigantine intends to spend affordable housing trust fund revenues pursuant to <u>N.J.A.C</u>. 5:97-8.7 through 8.9 and consistent with the housing programs outlined in the adopted housing element and fair share plan.

The City of Brigantine has a balance of \$2,071,586.58 as of July 1, 2022 and anticipates an additional \$323,200.00 in revenues before the expiration of its Judgement of Compliance and Repose for a total of \$2,394,786.58. The municipality will dedicate \$219,391.05 towards its Market to Affordable Program and \$950,000.00 to the VOADV Project, \$873,731.57 to render units more affordable, and \$351,663.96 to administrative costs. The municipality will dedicate any excess funds toward the Market to Affordable Program.
