

Title: Notice to Bidders – CDBG Pedestrian Improvements to West Beach Avenue & Roosevelt Boulevard

Sealed bids will be received by the City of Brigantine, Atlantic County, New Jersey for “**CDBG Pedestrian Improvements to West Beach Avenue and Roosevelt Boulevard**” and will be opened and read in public at City Hall, 1417 W. Brigantine Avenue, Brigantine, New Jersey 08203 on **February 26, 2026 at 11:00 a.m., Local Time.**

Plans, specifications, and forms of bid for the proposed work, prepared by **Arthur Chew Consulting, LLC**, have been filed in the office of said City of Brigantine and may be inspected by prospective bidders during business hours. Bidders will be furnished with a copy of the plans and specifications by requesting same via email to **achew@chewconsulting.com**.

Bids must be made on the Standard Proposal Forms in the manner designated therein and required by the specifications, must be enclosed in a sealed envelope bearing the name and address of the bidder and the name of the project on the outside, addressed to the City Clerk, City of Brigantine, and must be accompanied by a **Certified Check, Cashier’s Check, or Bid Bond** drawn to the order of the City of Brigantine for not less than **ten percent (10%)** of the amount bid, not to exceed **\$20,000.00**.

Each proposal must be accompanied by a **Non-Collusion Affidavit** and all other documents required by the contract documents.

This project is funded in part by the **Community Development Block Grant (CDBG)** Program. The **Davis-Bacon Act** prevailing wage rates apply. The contract documents contain requirements addressing **equal employment opportunity, minority and women business participation**, and **Section 3** residents and business concerns.

Bidders are required to comply with the requirements of **P.L. 1975, c.127** (N.J.A.C. 17:27), **Affirmative Action**, and **N.J.S.A. 10:5-31 et seq.** Bidders must also submit documentation of their outreach to minority and women business enterprises and to low- and moderate-income businesses.

The Federal Government Department of Labor’s wage provisions apply, as well as the **New Jersey Prevailing Wage Act**.

The City of Brigantine reserves the right to **reject any or all proposals**, to waive informalities, or to accept the bid which, in its judgment, best serves the interest of the City.
